#### Regina Williams Fields ~ Volunteer of the Month

Regina Williams Fields knows it is better to both give AND receive. CONTACT's newest Volunteer of the Month plays a unique dual role in the organization. After joining us about six years ago, Regina experiences both realms simultaneously.

She gets and gives calls and shared the perspective of each.

"It is refreshing to get a call from someone who is not a bill collector, someone who is not selling you anything and someone who just wants to say 'Good Morning, how are you doing?' "she says. "It drives me crazy that some people call others and they can't be nice to them."

Regina transfers that belief to the people she then calls.

"You build a relationship with people you reach out to," she indicates. "They become familiar with you and you get to know them too. What's great for them, I believe, is that this gives them something to look forward to. They know someone is going to call who cares about them. That's very important.

"I remember one time standing in line at a grocery store and realizing that I forgot to call someone," she adds. "I immediately reached out. Even though we didn't have a lot of time to talk, the person said Thank You for thinking of me.' That made me feel good because for some people, this call makes their day."

Regina loves the elderly community, because they dispense knowledge of life experience. Some of the clients, she said, are comical.

Regina moved here from Dayton, Oh and worked in several industries, including the casino world, before retiring and later being recruited by CONTACT.

The organization congratulates and appreciates her for the dual perspective of understanding CONTACT's role in the community.



The Gatekeeper Program trains community members to recognize the signs that a neighbor who lives alone could use some help. Training is available for public service companies such as cable and utilities, employees of local business such as banks, delivery companies, and others who have daily contact with local residents. Anyone can be a gatekeeper. Just let us know of the person in need. We are also able to connect clients with needed in-home services/referrals to help them continue living safely at home. The Gatekeeper Program helps individuals in the community learn to listen, observe and care for those adults living alone that may need help.


